



Training Modules to suit your lifestyle

The AA course has been specially prepared by experienced instructor trainers and comes in an easy to follow format.

The emphasis is on making you an excellent driving instructor, not simply good enough to pass. As an AA trained ADI, you'll be one of the best.

The training consists of home-based learning for the theory followed by on-the-road practical lessons. You'll go at your own pace so the training can fit in with your lifestyle but, as a rule, the course should take between 6 and 18 months. You can study parts 1 and 2 together if you really want to speed up the process or pay and train for each part separately.

Unlike other driving schools you'll only pay for each module as you proceed through the course. That helps spread the cost and helps reduce the burden on you at the start.

You'll get support throughout from a qualified instructor (via a helpline or dedicated e-mail) as well as a range of CDs and books. There is no classroom based activity, all training during Part 2 and 3 is one to one training with an instructor local to your area.

What's involved?


To join any ADI course you need to have held a valid driving licence for at least 3½ years before you commence training and be over 21. You'll need to be able to read a number plate from 27.5m / 90ft.

But you'll also need a commitment to learning and a desire to work with others, as being a driving instructor is very much a people job. That means keeping calm, maintaining authority and generating trust

The ADI exams are in three parts:

- 1. Computer-based theory and hazard perception tests
- 2. Practical driving test
- 3. Practical test of teaching ability

You must pass each part before the next exam can be taken and qualification must be within two years of passing the first part.

Part 1 – Theory

Working at home, and using CDs and manuals supplied by the AA, you work through the course and arrange the test when you are ready. The test comprises 100 multiple choice questions of which you need to get at least 85 right. You'll also need to achieve minimum marks of 80% in each of the four areas:

- Road Procedure
- Traffic Signs and Signals; Car Control; Pedestrians; Mechanical Knowledge
- · Driving Test; Disabilities; Law
- Publications; Instructional Techniques

There is also a hazard perception test. You will be shown 14 video clips, each containing at least one developing hazard. One of the clips will have two hazards to identify.

You need to get 57 out of a maximum of 75 marks to pass.

But remember, you may be working at home but you are not alone. With the AA support line and dedicated e-mail, there is advice and help on hand whenever you need it. We'll also give you mock tests to make sure you are ready.

Part 2 – Practical


This module consists of practical driving sessions and is designed to bring your personal standard of driving up to the high level required by the DSA/DVTA. You will train with one of our qualified driving instructors on a one to one basis who will be local to your area.

Your instructor will prepare you for a one-hour practical test of your driving ability. This is an advanced driving test and a very high standard of competence is required. Firstly you will be asked to complete an eyesight test and perform a check on the condition and safety of three components of the vehicle. You must be able to demonstrate a high level of driving technique, anticipation and consideration of other road users, you will also need to undertake a number of manoeuvres.

Part 3 – Instructional Ability

So far you will have shown you are a very good driver. Now you'll need to show you can teach others. This final part consists of two half-hour driving lessons where the examiner acts as a pupil in a role-play situation. This follows in-car training with your instructor.

Preparation for each module is backed by the AA support line advisers who will be on hand to offer help and guidance.

Questions and answers

What's the 'ADI licence'?

It's your licence to work as a fully qualified ADI in the UK and must be displayed on your vehicle windscreen when giving paid tuition.

How long will the course take?

It generally takes between 6 and 18 months to become an ADI

I'm worried about the theory test.

I've never been hot on exams

The test is multiple choice and requires no writing. You have to select one right answer from four possible answers. The hazard test is also computer based and requires just a click of the mouse button.

I'm not sure about paying money up front. What are the guarantees?

That's down to you! But you couldn't be in any better hands than with the AA where you'll have the peace of mind knowing you pay and train for each part separately rather than the whole course, and that you're being trained by an organisation with over 100 years of motoring experience.
